Circular No. H (December, 1891) announced as the policy of the University, that (at the close of the academic year) entrance examinations would be held in Palo Alto and simultaneously at other appointed places. This provision was continued until 1896, and it was customary to send entrance questions to any locality upon application of responsible parties. Thus, in 1895, such examinations were held at Portland, Los Angeles,...
